“Safe Room/In-Ground Shelter Program”

Since October 1999, the Arkansas Department of Emergency Management has administered the state’s Safe Room/In-Ground Shelter Program. The program offers a 50% rebate (up to \$1,000) to homeowners for the construction of safe rooms or storm shelters built on or after January 21, 1999. The program’s goal is to save lives by providing incentives to individual homeowners to build safe rooms in their homes, or install in-ground storm shelters on their property.

To receive additional information on the program and how to apply, contact your local emergency management office (usually housed within the county courthouse) or contact ADEM at 501-683-6700 and ask for the Safe Room Program Manager. You can also visit ADEM’s website at www.adem.arkansas.gov

PURPOSE: Provide reimbursement for cost associated with safe rooms or in-ground shelter installation in the amount of \$1,000 or 50% whichever is less.

ELIGIBILITY: Individuals who own their home at the time of application and who have installed a safe room / in-ground shelter after January 21, 1999.

This must be in your primary residence at the time you apply for the rebate.
(Please Note: Rental or lease properties are not eligible for rebates).

Each eligible homeowner can only receive one rebate, regardless of the number of shelters he/she may purchase in the future.

All applications must have the Applicants Social Security Number and the "physical" address where the structure is installed.

REQUIREMENTS: Safe rooms and in-ground shelters can be designed in a number of ways, however: The safe room / in-ground shelter must meet requirements established in **FEMA publication 320** and / or meet the **National Performance Criteria for Tornado Shelters** dated May 28, 1999.

NOTE: Safe rooms will need to have a certification notarized as being in compliance with FEMA Publication 320

In-ground shelters have no state regulation, however this office will require that it be constructed of a waterproof material, properly ventilated and the door must meet the National Performance Criteria for Tornado Shelters. The shelters must meet city and/or county codes if there are any.

Previously owned or used shelters will not be eligible for the grant. Only those shelters that come originally from the manufacturer or contractor.

DOCUMENTATION: Counties across Arkansas handle the Safe Room /In-ground Shelter program a bit differently, but the following documentation must be completed:

Homeowner must fill out the top portion of ADEM Form 301 and turn in to a local official (County Emergency Management Coordinator/or representative) with a pictures and cost documentation (invoices or canceled checks-show both front and back). Invoices and canceled checks must show the Company/Contractors name, address, phone, date the structure was completed. Safe Room invoices may need to be notarized.

The County Coordinator/County Judge must certify on the bottom portion of ADEM Form 301 that the installation meets the requirements stated. The completed forms must be mailed to the address at the top of this sheet.




1. WOOD (MIN 1.5"THICK) WITH 14 GA STEEL SHEATHING ON EITHER SIDE.

4. 16 GA STEEL FRAMES RECOMMENDED.

Safe Room Construction

Door should have three hinges and three dead bolts or slide bolts.

The Safe Room designs by Texas Tech and FEMA have doors of 14-gauge and 20-gauge steel.

Maintenance is a top priority for Safe Room and shelter doors.

When deciding on the size of the safe room consider the following:

The type of windstorm protection you need.

The number of people you will be sheltering

The everyday use of space.

Since many times safe rooms are already completed when the applicant applies for reimbursement it is impossible to determine if the structure is in compliance with FEMA Publication 320. Also many times the invoices/receipts are not sufficient to determine if required materials were used. To assure compliance the applicant should if possible take pictures of the structure in various stages of completion. If this is no longer an option the applicant can still use pictures of the completed safe room, however they will need to show legitimate receipts of the materials and associated cost, to verify compliance. If accompanied with the contractor's invoice, the invoice will need to show the name of the contract to, address, phone number, and date structure was completed. This invoice will need to be notarized. **NOTE: Notarized statement should say on it that it is "in compliance with FEMA Publication 320". See next page**

Arkansas Safe Room/Shelter Rebate Program

The Arkansas Safe Room/Shelter Rebate Program provides a reimbursement to homeowners who have installed storm shelters at their primary residence. Since it is a rebate program, the shelter has to be installed before you apply for the rebate. Shelters need to be built to the specifications in FEMA Publication 320, which can be found online at fema.gov or by calling 1-800-480-2520. When the shelter is finished, contact your Local Emergency Management (EM) Coordinator. He/she verifies that the shelter/safe room has been installed and completes the bottom of the application form. The program reimburses 50% of the costs with a maximum rebate of \$1,000.00.

These are the documents that are needed for the rebate:

- 1) Completed application form. The applicant/homeowner will complete and sign Part I, and the Local EM Coordinator will complete and sign Part II.
- 2) If it is an above ground shelter or safe room, the certification/affidavit form must be completed by your builder and notarized, stating that the safe room was built to the specifications of FEMA Publication 320. (This step is not necessary for in-ground shelters.)
- 3) Proof of cost and payment – Copies of invoices and/or receipts, along with proof of payment; i.e., canceled checks, credit card receipt, cash receipts.
- 4) Pictures showing the inside connections on the door and the hinges. The door needs to have 3 hinges and 3 slide bolts or 3 dead bolts.
- 5) Picture of the ventilation.
- 6) For underground shelters, pictures of the sides and back.

The Arkansas Dept of Emergency Management (ADEM) Shelter Rebate Program will open in July 2014. Notice will be made to the public when we will start receiving applications. Shelter Rebate applications that were received prior to July 17, 2013, but were not funded on the July 2013 cycle will be honored first from this year's funding. We will open up a window for accepting applications. Notice of this window will be posted on our website and we will notify the County EM Coordinators. Please do not send in your application now because it will be returned.
